How to plan a Bike to School Day!

Pre-Event

- Send a letter and confirm school participation with principal
- Reach out to your PTO and/or LSC to see if they'll support it
 - Ask school to share announcements in existing communications and social media parents group
- Find an alternative lead in case you/your family is sick; rain plan for bad weather
- Make a bike parking plan with the school and share with families
- Register event with National Bike to School Day website and Chicago Family Biking

Optional:

- Plan before/after school activities with support from the school
- Ask teachers/staff to join in

Day of Event

- Take lots of pictures and ask others for their pictures
 - Send them to the school to post of socials
 - Also tag @chicagofamilybiking or share with <u>chicagofamilybiking@gmail.com</u> so we can share on our channels
- Keep in communication with your collaborators and volunteers
- Make a plan for meeting kids/families at the school
 - Stickers or stamps for participating kids
- Bring a bike-related book for your kid(s) class to read

- Engaging Community Partners
- Engaging Alderperson
- Identify easy routes to school from various directions
 - Make an interactive google map to show bike lanes around the school boundaries, safe routes
- Print stickers or bring a stamp for the kids who participated
- Offer helmet fittings
 - SAFE Ambassadors

- Work with school to include SAFE Ambassador programming
- After school bike obstacle course
- Bike Zoo
- Organize a bike bus day of

- Offer Bike Valet day of
- Host a bike tune up day the week before


Bike Buses Bike to School Day


- If you already know some families who bike to your school, you could plan a bike bus!
- Needs to be inclusive invite everyone to join and make sure to include it in the school communications
- Consider the neighborhood boundaries and what is possible
 - > One large bus route or a few smaller routes with different leads?
 - > Who will lead? Do you have an sub if you can't make it?
 - > Right turns, one ways, stop signs, limited lights, slow traffic streets make good routes
- Think about timing of the route
- Reach out to our community partners for support for leading, corking, keeping the group together so you can also focus on your kid(s)
- Create a google map showing the route(s) and meeting places
- Ask teachers/staff to join in
- Consider it a test for a future weekly bike bus!

Bike Buses Weekly/Monthly

- Use Bike to School Day as a way to recruit/advertise for a school bike bus
- Same ideas apply to this bike bus, needs to be inclusive
- Take what you've learned from Bike to School Day about where people are coming from to help consider the route
 - > One large bus route or a few smaller routes with different leads?
 - Who will lead? Do you have an sub if you can't make it? Who will cork or help with busy crossings?
- How do you communicate any changes or cancellations?
- Think about timing of the route and bell schedule
- Create a google map showing the route(s) and meeting places
- Ask teachers/staff to join in
- Be consistent, so people know you'll show up.
- Sometimes, it might just be you, and that's ok!






Bike to School Day Example



B2S Example Nettelhorst 2022

- First time school participated
- All volunteer coordinated without any school support (beside comms)
- Three bike buses, since arterial locked
 - SAFE Ambassador led one segment
- Had at least 30 kids who participated
- Not allowed to lock bikes to fence, so pointed families to local bike racks
- Supported by Assistant Principal
- Gave out stickers to kids who participated, sent book about biking to my kid's class



B2S Example Nettelhorst 2022

Success of Bike to School Day led to:

- Kidical Mass creation/participation for Lakeview East
- Weekly Bike Bus (Fridays!)
- Walk, Roll and Bike to School Day event in October 2022, co-hosted by PTO
 - After school event that included a bike obstacle course, SAFE Ambassadors doing helmet fittings
 - Bike Bus day-of with Bike Grid and SAFE marshals
- PTO community events team co-sponsoring Walk/Roll and Bike to School Days moving forward


